# THE Roots of Rochester SWEEPS festival



**The Rochester Sweeps Festival is a celebration deeply rooted in history, dating back 300 years, when chimney sweeping was both a grimy necessity and a tough trade, especially for the chimney boys who bore the brunt of the labour. 1 May, the Sweeps' yearly holiday, provided a much-needed respite, marked by a joyous procession winding through the streets.**

Yet, with the enactment of the Climbing Boys Act in 1875, which prohibited the employment of young boys in chimney cleaning, the tradition gradually withered away, and by the early 1900s, the festive spirit of Sweeps in Rochester had fizzled out.

Enter Gordon Newton, the historian with a knack for both research and melodeon-playing. In the vibrant 1980s, he breathed new life into the Sweeps Festival, spearheading a small parade featuring Morris dancers from his own Motley Morris crew.

Since then, the festival has blossomed into a must-attend event, attracting legions of locals and tourists alike. From spirited dance troupes to eclectic musical acts, the festivities offer something for everyone, with tunes ranging from folk melodies to rocking guitar riffs and traditional songs.
